
To see the entire area, one must plan a full day in the Argentinean park, which is open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

In Puerto Iguassu information is available at the Information Bureau located at 396 Victoria Aguirre Street (open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m); phone: 420800. There is also an information booth at the local bus station.

300 meters from the Interpretation Area is the central train station. Just before it, on the right there is an area called Green Path - Sendero Verde. From this area, it is possible to reach the Upper Circuit - Circuito Superior and the Lower Circuit - Circuito Inferior on foot. The first train to the Upper Ciucuit (Circuito Superior) and the Lower Circuit (Circuito Inferior) departs at 8:30 a.m. from the one on the left every 30 minutes. When you reach the Lower and Upper train station (Estación Cataratas) get the Devil's Throat - Garganta del Diablo train which departs every 30 minutes. To San Martin Island last ferryboat departs at 3:15 p.m., from the Lower Circuit and during 80% of the year the island it is closed. For one that likes to walk there is the Sendero del Macuco - Macuco Trail. It is a 7 km return walking trail in the forest. It is open until 3:30 p.m. For this trail one need to come back on the next day.

Find out from locals how the islands are constructed; as the layers closest to the water start to rot, they are replaced with fresh reeds on top.


Day 43 – Wednesday 22nd February

Cusco's Plaza de Armas

Cusco's long and eventful history is one of the most interesting features of the city. Inca walls and temples coexist with colonial and contemporary architecture, sometimes all in the same building! Cusco's lovely Plaza de Armas was known as Huacaypata in the time of the Incas, and was much larger. Much like today, the plaza then was the center of the city, with parades and military displays held there regularly.

The Cathedral and La Compania church

The beautiful



Cathedral and La Compania church that dominates the plaza are built atop former Inca palaces, and colonial buildings with stone archways and pretty balconies forms its boundaries. Just a short walk from the Plaza are two excellent examples of Inca stonework.

Hatun Rumiyoc street

The first stop is Hatun Rumiyoc street, where a portion of what was probably the former Palacio de la Inca Roca and is now the Museum of Religious Art is located. Three sides of the building are made up of large, beautifully carved stones, fit together like puzzle pieces. The most famous piece is the 12-angled stone, which is a source of Cuzqueña pride for its perfection. There is a great deal of legends that involve the stone, but none have been definitively proven to be true. What is certain though is the incredible craftsmanship and knowledge that was required to carve and construct such beautiful walls. Take time to appreciate the Inca's masterful work and search for hidden animal forms in the wall, before continuing on to the Qoricancha, or Temple of The Sun.

Qoricancha

Located at the intersection of Avenida del Sol and Puente Rosario streets, the Qoricancha was once the Inca's most sacred temple and is said to have been completely plated in gold at the time the Spanish arrived in Cusco. The

Spanish quickly took possession of the gold, demolished much of the temple, and begin construction Santo Domingo Convent over what remained. Today the convent and Qoricancha remains still stand. While the gold is gone, the magnificent stonework of the Incas is apparent, along with the lovely convent.

The Museo de Arte Precolombino (MAP)

The Museo de Arte Precolombino is a great starting point in the city of Cusco, with an excellent collection of prehispanic artifacts and artwork from different cultures all over Peru. The museum also has an excellent restaurant, MAP Café, where you can stop for a delicious lunch in the pretty Plaza Nazarenes. From there, the Museo Inca is only a five minutes walk, and one of the most interesting museums in Cusco.

Museo Inca

Museo Inca features Inca artifacts and information from pre-Hispanic through colonial times, and will give you special insight into Cusco's complex and fascinating history.

Museo Hilario Mendvil

A nice contrast with these two indigenous-themed museums is the Museo Hilario Mendvil, located in the artist's quarter of the city, San Blas. Hilario Mendivil was a famous religious sculptor with a unique and joyful approach to his work. The museum features many of his original pieces and is located in the artist's former home.

San Blas

After you stop in here, wander around San Blas and explore the tiny stores and restaurants that line the narrow streets and winding walkways that characterize the neighbourhood.





Colonial Quito & the Middle of the World (5h). Quito, UNESCO World Cultural Heritage site, is a multicoloured urban quilt draped across the steep slopes and undulating inter-Andean valleys at the foot of Pichincha Volcano. Strolling the narrow cobblestone streets of Quito's old-town is like walking through time and back again amidst splendid 16th century architecture, churches bathed in gold, convents tucked away behind hand–carved baroque doors and block upon block of Spanish-style villas with their charming hidden courtyards.

The Middle of the world complex and the Equator Monument situated at 0°0′0″ latitude where the 18th century French Geodesic Expedition built one of the three pyramids as landmarks for their planet calculations to deduce the shape of the earth.

Depart from Quito in the morning, flight to Francisco de Orellana (Coca), arriving to Coca after a short 30 minutes trip. Transfer to the Napo River port then the motorized canoe ride downstream will be approximately one and a half hours; during the trip we will provide important information about the region. Once on board the Manatee Amazon Explorer will start navigating down the Napo River for the whole afternoon. 

After lunch at the Manatee, you will stop at a Native House of the Kichwas a native guide will bring into the light their way of life and traditions.

Day 51 – Thursday 2nd March

In the morning we will continue to visit one of the tallest trees of the Rainforest, the Kapok, a native guide also will explain to us the use of medicinal plants, if time permits we will have a visit to the CICAME Archeological Museum which preserves pottery from the Omagua Culture, one of the first forest pre-Columbian residents of the Napo River basin. 

Flight to Baltra. As we arrive to the Islands you will go to Puerto Ayora on Island Santa Cruz. Beside its rank as home stay for sea lions and pelicans, the marina is a popular starting point for round-the-world-yachtsman. The island itself has come to be both tourist and scientific center of the archipelago. Here you will visit the highlands of Santa Cruz. The lush landscape there is a welcome contrast to the arid scenery of the smaller, lower islands. On your way you will cross the different zones of vegetation, from the dry lower region full of cactuses to the woods of scalesia in the highland. (L, D)

Day 57 – Wednesday 8th March

Today you will land at Santiago Island, also known as James, or San Salvador Island, which is the fourth largest island in the archipelago. The influences of the former salt mine workers and their imported animals are still alive on the island. The last tries to populate Santiago Island were given up forty years ago. Visit the dark sand beach with a lot of marine iguanas at Egas Port after a wet landing. After a short walk of about 2 km along the coast you will reach the cliffy lava coast with natural pools where sea lions take a bath and herons and other sea birds are as well local. Additionally, you can encounter a small group of sea bears.

The surrounding area is good for spotting and observing colonies of sea lions, red sally light-foot crabs, lava iguanas, Galapagos buzzards and lava herons. After lunch on board you will make an excursion to the small volcano island Rabida with its dark red beach. A small path there leads you to the little lagoon, which is often visited by flamingos. On your way to this lagoon you will pass nesting pelicans and other sea birds. The beach of Rabida Island is considered as one of the most beautiful places to go snorkelling. Because of a huge richness of fishes you can also observe a lot of sea lions there. (B, L, D)

Day 58 – Thursday 9th March

Arriving at Bartolome you will ascend a lookout point from where you can admire the spectacular panorama of the Sullivan Bay and the famous needle shaped rock, the so called Pinnacle Rock. The beaches at the foot of the Pinnacle Rock boast some fine snorkelling spots from which you can discover the marvelous underwater world with a good chance to encounter penguins or the softly gliding turtles. In the afternoon you will land at Santiago Island, also known as James, or San Salvador Island, which is the fourth largest island in the archipelago. The influences of the former salt mine workers and their imported animals are still alive on the island. The last tries to populate Santiago Island were given up forty years ago. Sullivan Bay is located on the east coast of Santiago Island. Its lava field with lava cacti is a variety of interesting patterns. After exploring the lava flow, you can swim or snorkel with playful sea lions off two small corallines. (B, L, D)

Day 59 – Friday 10th March

We will visit the nearby Black Turtle Cove, a nesting site for marine turtles. With good luck you can observe different types of sharks in the calm water, so for example the white-tipped shark or schools of golden mustard rays and you will have a short walk along the coast of the northernmost island of Seymour. Guests will encounter swallow tailed gulls, sea lions and cliff crabs. This site is also known for being a major nesting colony of blue footed boobies, and the largest colony of the magnificent frigate bird, a species different to the great frigate bird. You can also spot both endemic species of iguanas, the marine iguanas and land iguanas. (B, L, D)

Day 60 – Saturday 11th March

Today you will explore South Plaza Island, the more southern island of the both Plaza Island, located in the east of Island Santa Cruz. On this island, so full of life, you will encounter colonies of sea lions and land iguanas. On the steep banks it is possible to see a great Number of birds such as nesting tropic birds and fork-tailed seagulls. But most of all, enjoying the beautiful view from atop the steep banks or strolling along the base of the cliff is an extremely pleasurable experience.

The Opuntia cactus and red coral bushes grow here and the vegetation changes colour according to the seasons of the year. In the afternoon you visit Santa Fe Island, a small rocky peninsula which is covered by little Palo Santo trees and by up to 6m high opuntia cacti. Inhabitants of this island are a specific species of large yellow land iguanas, the Galapagos buzzard, some blue footed boobies and pelicans. After the hike, you can swim or snorkel in the bay in company of sea lions and marine turtles. Finally, you can observe the tropic underwater world. (B, L, D)

Day 61 – Sunday 12th March

Española is the southernmost and oldest island of the Galapagos archipelago. Because of its isolated position you can explore a lot of endemic wildlife. Gardener Bay is on the eastern shore with turquoise shot coloured water and a magnificent beach. Around the small islets nearby, snorkelers will find lots of fish and sometimes turtles and sharks. The bay is also frequented by a transient colony of sea lions which like to swim with you. Birds, like the endemic Hood-Mockingbird and different species of Darwin finches, are omnipresent.

In the afternoon, you will have an excursion to Point Suarez which is one of the most outstanding wildlife areas of the archipelago, with a long list of species found along its cliffs and sand or pebble beaches. In addition to five species of nesting seabirds there are the curious and bold Española Island mockingbirds, Galapagos doves and Galapagos hawks. Several types of reptiles, including the marine iguana and the oversized lava lizard, are unique to this island. When heavy swells are running, Point Suarez is also the site of a spectacular blowhole, with thundering spray shooting 30 yards into the air. The walkabout on a stony path is about 2km (duration about 3 hours). (B, L, D)

Day 62 – Monday 13th March

Floreana Island is perceived as one of the most exotic Island of the archipelago. At Cormorant Point you land on a green olivine sand beach. Following a 100 m long path you will soon reach a lagoon with flamingoes, white-checked pintail ducks and other shorebirds. Afterwards you will visit the famous Post Office Bay which keeps the legendary post barrel that whalers historically used to post their mail in. Nowadays you can leave a letter and hope that it will make its destination via another tourist. (B, L, D)







Castillo de San Marcos





Throughout its history, the Castillo de San Marcos National Monument has been closely intertwined with the city and the neighboring structures which served as the city's outer defenses - Fort Mose to the north and Fort Matanzas to the south. The Castillo and the town serve as outstanding reminders of the might of the early Spanish empire in the New World.

Given the architectural details, it's hardly surprising that Castillo de San Marcos took 23 years to build (from 1672 to 1695).

Numerous historic events have taken place within the walls of this ancient stalwart including the imprisonment of Seminole tribe leader Chief Osceola after he was captured in 1837. Fabricated of coquina, a virtually indestructible limestone comprised of broken sea shells and coral, the walls of the fortress remained impenetrable through 300 years of enemy shelling and pounding by violent storms.

Lightner Museum



History buffs will adore the many museums in the area. The Lightner Museum is among the most unique, featuring an intriguing array of items, from shrunken heads and mummies to stunning collections of stained glass and crystal.


When it opened its doors in 1889, Henry Flagler's Alcazar Hotel delighted guests with its gigantic indoor pool and retractable roof, casino, spa, and movie theater. O.C. Lightner jumped at the opportunity to live in the hotel when it became available for purchase and house his unique collections here.



St Augustine Lighthouse & Maritime Museum

A Spanish watchtower, built in the late 1500's was the predecessor of the present St. Augustine Lighthouse. St. Augustine is the site of the oldest, permanent aid to navigation in North America. A series of wooden watchtowers evolved into Florida's first lighthouse.

The Lighthouse is St. Augustine's oldest surviving brick structure, and today the site is restored to colours and materials used the year 1888. In 1876, a brick light keeper's house was added to the property, a triplex that held two families and a young, single, 2nd assistant keeper, most often of Menorcan descent.
